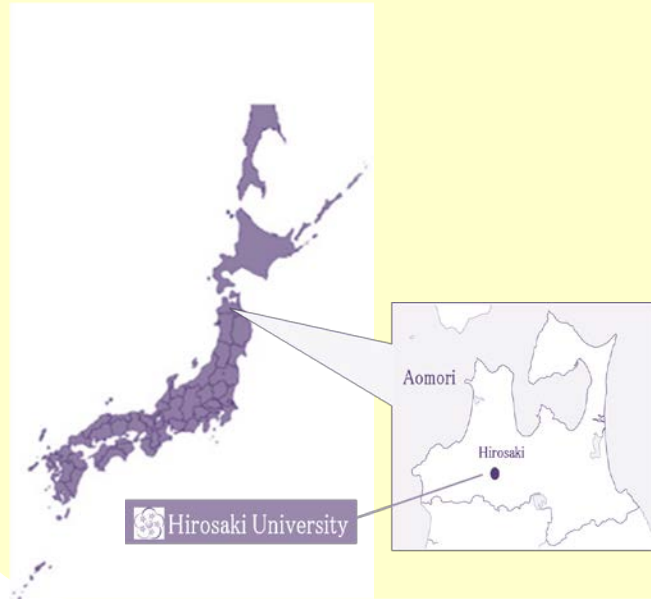

1. Program Fees

Approx. 280 USD will cover the following costs.

2. Other Expenses

5. Accommodation (International House)

Check in : July 22nd
Check out : August 3rd
Room type : Shared room (2 to 3 participants per room)

Facilities : Bed, Bedding, Table, Chair, Bathroom, Washing machine, Refrigerator, Vacuum cleaner, Free Wi-Fi



3. Total number of participants

The maximum number of participants to be accepted is 10 in total.

Participants will receive notification regarding the results of their application through their home university

4. Credit recognition

Participants who successfully complete the program will earn 3 credits as follows.

Japanese Language: 1 credit
Japanese Culture : 2 credits

Successful participants will be also issued a certificate of completion.



6. English Proficiency

Participants should be proficient in English.
As a rough indication, the following level is required.

- ◆ TOEFL-iBT: 61
- ◆ TOEFL- PBT : 500
- ◆ IELTS : 5.0
